1893 Henry Niemann Organ, 22 stops, 23 ranks, combination action. This magnificent organ is the largest of the extant organs built by Henry Niemann. It is completely intact possessing all its mechanical actions, pipes and unique manual pumping mechanism. Henry Niemann, a lesser known American master Organbuilder, apprenticed with A. Cavaille-Coll in Paris prior to emigrating to America. He built about 40 organs incorporating many techniques not used by other better known and popular American organbuilders. His instruments are unsurpassed in quality of design and construction. He understood tonal architecture and adapted Cavaille-Coll's methods to the American style of worship and church building. The voicing is breathtaking. The handsome decorated façade is comprised of pipes from the Great Double and Open Diapasons. The three-sided case is of quarter-sawn oak. This is the largest, completely intact and unaltered Henry Niemann organ remaining. Extensive sound recordings are available.
